 - 67 cases (28%) are pending further information or statutory declaration.
- (ii) For cases referred to the PIC meeting, some of them will be carried forward to the PIC meetings to be held in 2002.
- (iii) The major categories of cases on disregard of professional responsibilities to patients in 2001 include:
 - (1) failure/unsatisfactory result of surgery (22%)
 - (2) failure to properly/timely diagnose illness or to give proper advice (25%)


